"When one third of the world population does not have access to safe water, 1001fontaines brings a global and sustainable solution to deal with water crisis on a large scale.

Our NGO has proven its impact on health, economic development, education and environment. Fifteen years after its creation, 1001fontaines is today implemented in four countries: Cambodia, Madagascar, Vietnam and Myanmar.

To increase our impact, we have chosen to freely deliver water in schools nearby the villages where we are located in. Indeed, children are the most affected people by waterborne diseases and register an important mortality death rate due to diarrhea. I wish to thank all our Water Angels for their support: thanks to them, 278,000 school children were able to drink clean water every day in 2019."


- We **create** micro-factories to produce safe water, the **Water Kiosks**;

In 2008, 1001fontaines launched the Water In School program. The aim is to freely deliver safe water in the schools of the villages where we have implemented a Water Kiosk. Thanks to its important impact, this program has been replicated by other organisations since its creation.

The program is fully subsidised to entrepreneurs, enabling them to deliver daily free water in primary schools, without threatening the sustainability and autonomy of their activity. Entrepreneurs enter the program when they reached breakeven, which is about 3 to 4 months after the Water kiosk launching. The Water In School program represents 20% of their turnover.



Safe water consumption entails a decrease of diarrhea, and a good hydration improves **school** capabilities of children.



Through the distribution of free drinking water in schools, we contribute to a decrease in student absenteeism of up to 75%, and then an improvement of school results.



Free from the water duty, girls are more and more at school.

A study was conducted in 2013 by the University of East Anglia in the United-Kingdom with the help of Professor Hunter to evaluate the impact of our program on education, tracking 3,000 school children across ten schools during six months.

The study concluded that absenteeism dropped up from 55 to 75% in the schools offering free safe drinking water. Access to drinking water also improves children's attention and overall cognitive capabilities, and as such contributes to better results in school.

## **A SPECIAL ATTENTION DEDICATED TO AWARENESS RAISING**

In order to increase the impact of the project, we have developed **awareness programs about water and hygiene**, in our countries of operation but also in France, Switzerland and the United-Kingdom. Behaviours change is a key component of the project: villagers are accustomed to use water from wells and ponds and have never established a link between diarrhea and the water they consume.

#### WATER IN SCHOOL IN THE FIELD

In 2019, we strengthened our awareness programs in the field.

In Cambodia, during the school year 2018-2019, 226 awareness sessions were led by Teuk Saat 1001, our local partner. For instance, a meeting was organised between pupils of the Preah Dak Primary School and those from Swiss Champittet school to raise awareness among children regarding health and hygiene through Olympic Games, workshops using old water jugs as plant pots, and waste cleanups.

Beyond the real benefit for children, this educational method helps to target parents and to strengthen our local integration. In Madagascar, the Water In School program is one of the main components of our social marketing strategy.

That aspect was underlined in the 2019 evaluation made by Cota along with the French Development Agency about the impact of our action in Madagascar over the last five years. Not only the program improved children's health and entailed a decrease in absenteeism rate, but also school children were more and more encouraging their family to change their habits into the consumption of Ranontsika's water, which is our partner in Madagascar.






#### WATER IN SCHOOL IN FRANCE, IN SWITZERLAND AND IN THE UNITED-KINGDOM

Furthermore, we have developed a program to raise awareness and involve schools in France, in Switzerland and in the United-Kingdom thanks to our teams of volunteers. In a world where children have become the leaders of social transformation, we wish to help them create their own initiatives for 1001fontaines. We thus created a dedicated website to encourage them into the creation of their own charity challenges, we proposed teaching materials and videos about water issues... Numerous projects reflect the strength of their commitment: a birthday pot in Vietnam, a children's flash mob to celebrate the World Water Day in Geneva, creation of personal fundraising campaigns in France, movie production in the United-Kingdom... #### THE EXAMPLE OF A SUCCESSFUL AWARENESS EVENT: JUNIOR OLYMPIC GAMES IN MADAGASCAR

On 20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup> August 2019, Ranontsika, 1001fontaines' local partner NGO in Madagascar, organised junior Olympic Games for the EPP Morano public school children, in the area of Taomasina where 1001fontaines is settled.

This event gathered 72 school children, 6 teachers, the school director and some parents, enabling Ranontsika's team members to raise awareness among all participants about safe water, hydration and hygiene issues.



Divided into 6 teams, children participated in various games organised by Ranontsika and teachers: relay races to fill in a bottle of water, fill in a bucket of water with a sponge... The winning teams were able to join the final games during the second day.

Our team members organised quizzes all day long. Here are some examples of the questions asked to children, teachers and parents: What is clean for you? To what extent is Ranontsika's water different from others? Do you know some waterborne diseases? What is the colour of Ranontsika's water? How many liters of water are needed for a child/adult per day? What should you do before drinking Ranontsika's water? Name three advantages for a school children who drinks enough safe water every day etc.

To add value to their commitment and attention to these issues, all children were given prizes: sweets, scholar furniture, Ranontsika notebooks and key rings...

The winning team had the opportunity to visit a Water Kiosk in Analamalotra. The agenda of the tour was: Introduction of the Ranontsika's team, reminder of water issues and presentation of the 1001fontaines' solution, explanation of the water purification and delivery process, reminder of the importance of jugs cleaning, and at the end a tasting of Ranontsika's water.

The awareness campaigns among children have had an incredible impact on the whole community: during the visit, most of participants did not know it was possible to purify water in another way than boiling it and treating it with chlorine. Now, they can spread the word among the community, which contributes to raise awareness to safe water issues among a whole village.


